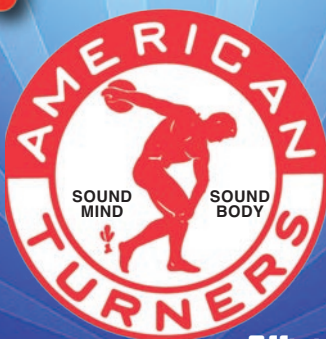

National Health & Physical Education

Greetings to my fellow Turners. It's hard to believe another year has gone by. We have much to prepare for in 2019. Please support our national tournaments with participation at one or more of the following events:

1. National Bowling Tournament hosted by Aurora Turners in April/May, 2019
2. National Golf Tournament hosted by Syracuse Turners July 10-12, 2019
3. National Softball Tournament hosted by Ft. Wayne Turners on June 29, 2019

In case you haven't heard, *Ft. Wayne Turners will be hosting the 55th National Festival: July 24-27, 2019*. We have roughly 6 months to get in shape, choreograph routines, organize volleyball or pickleball teams, do some fund raising or create some arts and crafts. If you are not sure about participating, please give it some serious thought. The Festival is not just for "athletes"... It is for everyone! If you can jog/walk 3 miles, swim some laps in the pool, swing a golf club, or just have fun on the Volleyball or Pickleball court, you should join us. So if you think you are not good enough because you do not work out in the gym every day, think again. Some Turners go for the competition; others go just to have fun. Either way, we all enjoy the camaraderie. So don't miss out on a good time.

A special issue of Turner Topics will be sent out in the near future packed full of Festival information. But here are a few things I would like you to note:

1. Go to amturners.org/Festival to find the following pertinent information:
 - Updated Festival Rulebook and Supplemental Handbook
 - Video and instructions for the Marching and Mass Drill
 - Tentative Schedule
 - Hotel information
 - Festival Pin letter
2. On-line registration will start around April 1. The last day to register, without paying a late fee, is June 9, 2019. You can still register between June 10 and June 19, 2019, however you will have to pay a late fee of \$20.00 per person. Absolutely no registrations will be accepted after June 19, 2019.
3. Cultural competitors must register on-line and also mail their separate "cultural entry form" to Sue Knisley.
4. Youth Memberships must follow the rules as stated in the Festival Rulebook:

"Pursuant to the 2008 National Convention, it is acceptable for a child under the age of 18 to participate in Turner National events (physical and cultural competition) even if

their parents are not members. However, that child must be a paying enrolled student of a Turner society for at least 90 days prior to the National event and show proof of same. There will be an extra fee for a non-member (child under the age of 18) to compete at the National event. All adults must still be a Turner member in order to participate at a National event."

So make sure you get those Youth Membership applications for the year 2019, with appropriate payment, into the National Office no later than April 20, 2019. This will allow Kate time to process the application and get the membership card to the individual before they try to register for the Festival. I will follow up with the Society to confirm that each child is enrolled in their society program(s).

- 5 Transportation Fund for ALL participating adult members, children of members and youth members. To qualify, a person must be a member, a child of a member or a youth member and they must attend and participate at the Festival. This includes members entered in the cultural competition, as long as they are at the Festival. Each qualifying member will receive somewhere between \$0.25 -\$0.30 per mile, depending on the amount of participation. It will be calculated from your home society address to Ft. Wayne Turners (one-way). Complete details and the request form will be found on the American Turner website in the near future.

- 6 Keep checking the website for more Festival information.

ENDOWMENT TRUST FUND

HAPPY NEW YEAR from the ENDOWMENT TRUST FUND!

As is customary, each New Year begins with resolutions and promises made to improve oneself. The Endowment Trust has followed suit. Let me start by introducing to you the 2019 ETF Trustees. First, congratulations to Jim Goetz and Marion Oppelt whom were re-elected during last year's National Convention each to a 6-year term. Joining them are Ed Colton, Dave Mulrooney, John Beary and myself. The National President David Liptak serves as an ex officio member of the Endowment Trust.

During the annual meeting of the Endowment Trust held in September of 2018, President emeritus Ed Colton decided it was time for a change. After 22+ years of faithful and dedicated service, Turner Colton decided not to return as president of the Endowment Trust even though a motion was made to retain him as such. Turner Colton thanked everyone for their support and stood firm in his decision not to re-run. Elections continued where I, Thomas R (Tom) Bozonelos was elected as the new Endowment Trust President, David Mulrooney was elected as the Vice President and I'm pleased to announce Turner Colton was elected as the Secretary / Treasurer remaining a member of the Endowment Trust Executive Team.

The Endowment Trust has for many years provided financial assistance in the form of grants, donations, loans and scholarship awards. For example, in 2018, a total of 35 offerings totaling \$98,383.24 were provided to 17 different Societies and to 1 individual who received a scholastic award. This is the most assistance of this type made by any entity of American Turners ever!

Unfortunately, though it's cost the Endowment Trust a significant reduction in net assets considering our annual budget is between \$20k and \$25k. Repositioning some of our investments finding yields of 4%, we were able to more than double these to 9% – 9 ½%. Additionally, the Jahn Fund has graciously budgeted \$26k to assist the Endowment Trust with continuing to offer the 4 grants programs.

In addition to offering the 4 grant programs in 2019, donations, and the William R Meyer Honorary Scholarship award are available to the Societies and membership. Descriptions of these, their requirements and the application form can all be found on our web site at: <http://amturners.org/EndowmentTrustFund>. Note: The Trustees have suspended offering any new loans in 2019. Madison Turners and Concordia Turners currently have outstanding loans.

50/50 COMPUTER GRANT

The purpose of this grant is to provide Societies with electronic capabilities to communicate and manage records efficiently in all business dealings internally and externally with other Districts, Societies, the National Office and the American Turners membership as a whole.

50/50 PHYSICAL EDUCATION EQUIPMENT GRANT:

Purpose of this grant is to help those offering physical education classes to provide the latest in equipment to meet competition, safety and insurance requirements beneficial to both students, instructors and their Society.

GYM INSTRUCTORS SAFETY CERTIFICATION REIMBURSEMENT GRANT:

The Endowment Trust will REIMBURSE any American Turner Gym Instructor who has taken, passed and paid for their personal Safety Certification, otherwise known as "U101 Safety & Risk Management" <https://usagym.org/pages/education/courses/U101/> in the amount of \$65.00 for a member of the USA Gymnastics or \$85.00 for a non-member 18 year of age and older.

SOCIETY INSTRUCTOR PAYROLL COMPENSATION GRANT

"The Endowment Trust of American Turners offers an "Instructors Payroll Compensation Grant" to any Society, in good standing, that has teachers/instructors/coaches in their employ and control who are instructing regular scheduled classes of Physical Education. The Endowment Trust will reimburse a Society 20% up to a maximum amount of \$2,000 of the total wages of the teachers/instructors/coaches only in providing regularly scheduled classes of Physical Education."

The requesting Society can use this Grant ONLY for partial reimbursement of wages/compensation paid to qualified persons who have been hired specifically for the purpose of teaching/instructing/coaching students (male or female) enrolled in a class within physical education as offered and controlled by the Society named in the application.

ENDOWMENT TRUST DONATIONS:

The Endowment Trust offers donations in accordance with its mission statement as it appears in its Declaration of Trust. The Endowment Trust is commissioned to financially assist all levels of the American Turners organization e.g. National, District & Society for the purpose of perpetuating and promulgating the principles and purposes of the American Turners and/or their successors, and expanding the facilities thereof, as set forth in the Bylaws aka Principles and Statutes of American Turners.

WILLIAM R. MEYER HONORARY SCHOLARSHIP:

Established in 2010, this special scholarship award is being offered to an individual applicant who not only meets all the requirements of the National Scholarship award but possesses leadership qualities by being actively involved in their local Turner Society or local community events while exemplifying our Turner motto, "A Sound Mind in A Sound Body".

The William R. Meyer Honorary Scholarship is a separate standalone offering from the Endowment Trust. This scholarship is not associated with any other National, District or Society offered scholastic award which includes the American Turners National Scholarship.

We'd like to extend words of gratitude and appreciation thanking Baltimore Turners for their donation of \$1,000 to the Endowment Trust for the perpetuation of American Turners.

The financial assistance that the Endowment Trust provides to American Turners is primarily based on its investment income. We also accept monetary donations. Therefore, please keep in mind the next time your District holds a Convention to pass a hat. Or a donation can be made in remembrance of a loved one. You can be assured the Endowment Trust works hard to offer as many grants, donations, loans and scholarships as possible to perpetuate American Turner's motto of a Sound Mind in a Sound Body!

Dot was a member of St. Martha Catholic Church where she was deeply involved with the Alter Society and Senior Club. Her life was devoted to instructing gymnastics, coaching competitive gymnastics teams and physical education. She was an active member of the American Turners and a charter and founding member of River City Turners in Louisville, KY. Dot was a fierce competitor and performed in the annual Louisville Turners Circus, competed in the National Turnfest on numerous occasions and took many awards with the teams she coached at the National Festivals. She was inducted into the American Turners Hall of Fame in 1986, awarded the American Turners National Honor Key Award and was inducted into the Kentucky Gymnastics Hall of Fame in 2009. She also became a USA Gymnastics Judge in recent years.

A memorial service was held on December 13, 2018 at Highland Funeral Home in Louisville, KY. followed by a funeral mass on December 14, 2018 at St. Martha Catholic Church with burial at Cave Hill Cemetery.

Dot truly embodied a Sound Mind and Sound Body, she was a true force to be reckoned with and living proof that age is only a number. Knowing Dot, she is probably tumbling in the sky!

Syracuse Turners

ALFRED “Al-Katraz” KNIESER

1924 - 2018



Al joined the Syracuse Turners in 1942 at the age of 18. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II in the European campaign reaching the rank of Sergeant and received a Purple Heart during the Battle of the Bulge. After the war, Al obtained a degree of Bachelor of Science in Physical Education and Recreation from Indiana University School of Health, Physical education & Recreation. After graduation, he worked in the Chicago area and then returned to Syracuse where he was employed with the North Syracuse School District for over 35 years. Al taught physical education and served as a high school gymnastics, wrestling, and track coach for many years winning many sectional and NYS championships. He also served as the golf coach in the same school district for over 40 years. Al loved his many years of teaching and was an inspiration to so many of his former students.

Al also was an instructor in our Syracuse Turner youth gymnastics classes in the 1950's and 1960's while we had our gymnastics program. Al and his wife Barb were our Syracuse Turners Goodwill Ambassadors as they traveled through the country and Europe visiting as many Turners clubs as they could.

Al was a “legend” at our club and our club historian and will be missed by all who knew him. He was a 76-year member of our club. He taught many of us how to be a “True Turner” putting others before yourself and to promote Turnerism as best as you can. He was best known for his crazy “antics” and silly hats, crazy ideas and especially his singing of great Turner songs. He was forever the “teacher” and we, his “students”, loved sitting around singing silly drinking songs and listening to him as he would recite/sing one drink toast after another. And in typical Al Knieser fashion, he waited until the day after the National Golf Tournament in Keystone ended before he decided it was time to head over the rainbow.

Al is now with his beautiful wife, Barb who predeceased him in 1999. Al is survived by his son Stephan and his wife, Regina, his daughter Heidi and her son Eichel and many nieces and nephews along with his adopted Turner family.

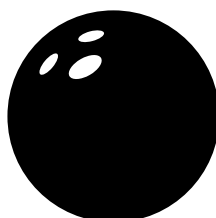

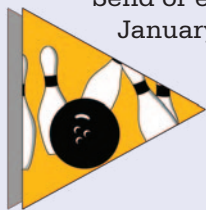
