THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



My Fellow Turners,

It's hard to believe we are in the year 2020. I hope you all had a great Holiday Season.

Athletic Events for 2020:

We start the year with our Junior National Bowling, which runs from February 15th to March 15th. Our youth bowl at the alleys convenient to them. We then head to Syracuse, NY the weekend of May 2-3 for our National

Bowling Tournament. Next up we go to Louisville, KY June 27-28 for our National Softball Tournament. We have only had 3 Societies as of late participate, I know we have more softball players out there. Let's see if we can have a few more societies represented. National Golf in Aurora, July 8,9,10, will be the last of our National Athletic Events for 2020. We are possibly going to offer a Junior Golf event and run it like we do our Junior Bowling. Our youth can play on their local courses and submit scores. We are also looking into a National Gymnastics meet (we need a Society to host) and with the participation we had in Pickleball at the National Festival, hopefully we can get a Society to host a National Pickleball Tournament. Thank you to the Societies that will be hosting our National Athletic Events this year. These take dedicated volunteers to run these events, and what we have seen is that these volunteers build lasting relationships with their fellow volunteers making their Societies stronger.

Cultural Events for 2020:

At this time we have no National Cultural Events scheduled. This is an area we need to greatly improve on. As our Members get older, it is becoming harder for some to participate in Athletic Events, but they could participate in Cultural Events. And as evidence at our National Festival, we have many talented Turner Members, in many different categories. There are also many categories where we can get our youth involved, we just need someone to take the initiative to put together a National Cultural event on a Yearly basis.

National Convention:

Our National Convention will be held in Louisville, Kentucky August 7-8. Louisville has many attractions to visit, and the Louisville Society has an extraordinary Circus venue they will be sure to be displaying. We will hopefully have all the Delegates that are allowed per District at this Convention.

Finances:

We have very important business to take care of at this Convention. There will be resolutions regarding the increase in dues paid to the National, which are needed to keep us in business. We have shared the Financials with your District Representatives, so you can see why this increase is needed. We currently collect \$8.25 per dues paying member. The dues breakdown to \$6.50 of that goes to run the National Office, \$1 goes to the National Festival Fund, .25 cents goes to Youth Transportation Fund, .50 cents goes towards Scholarship Fund. As mentioned in my last report, the National Council has done a great job of reducing costs, the National Office was closed, saving over \$7,000 a year, and travel expenses to National Council meetings will be decreased. They have been continually looking for ways to decrease the costs of the Turner Topics which is currently funded by the Jahn Fund at approximately \$24,000 a year.

Elections

We will be electing a New President for sure, I will be completing my 3rd (third) 2 Year term and this is the maximum length of time one can hold this Office. I am hopeful that potential candidates will declare they are running, and for what position and why in this Turner Topics or at the latest the Topics before the Convention. This election is too important to wait until the Convention to know who is running.

SilkStart

We are continuing our roll out of the SilkStart program, which will help Societies stay connected with the National Office and other Societies, make renewals easier, help with local promotions, and communications within the Organization. One of the key components is having help at the Society level to add member's information and preferences so the benefits can be realized. With SilkStart, the goal is to be able to target and communication in real time with members that are interested in Our National Events and their results. We're making all of this available for our Societies too. Everything we do depends on Members who are willing to get involved and volunteer their time and talents to help us continue to exist. We need members who have some computer skills from each Society to help us build your Society's database. Looking forward to seeing you at a National Event. May God Bless You and Keep You.

The Elgin Turners Club recently adopted the increasingly popular "sip and paint party" events. Scheduled monthly or bi-monthly, Turner members, as well as their friends and family, join together for three hours of creativity, fun and relaxation. The cost typically ranges from \$25-\$45 per person, depending on the design selection and material.

Participants anxiously filter in, choose their seats in front of easels and a blank canvas or wood pallet on plastic covered tables – with paper plates serving as their palettes. An artist guides them, step-by-step, on how to paint the club's chosen design from the company's gallery (rivers, snow scenes, beaches, etc.). While they paint, participants enjoy beverages and snacks from the grill and engage in lively conversations. When finished, they get to take their creations home.

Many participants have never painted before and some aren't confident they can do well – but a sip of wine and encouragement from the group and the instructor helps ease that anxiety! At a recent event, a participant stood back and examined her painting and said with satisfaction, "I painted that!" There is no such thing as bad art – the joy is in making it. And at the Elgin Turners – we create that joy together by painting, laughing and relaxing together.

A variety of "sip and paint" chains and single-outlet operations are located throughout the country. Look for one in your club's area!

- 1. The members entered below agree to abide by the rules and regulations of the American Turners and the USGA. Violations will result in the loss of prizes and awards.
- 2. Only National Turner Members in good standing in the National American Turners, local districts, and societies are permitted to participate in this tournament. At Large members may participate in the tournament, however, their scores cannot be used for a society's score in a team event.
- 3. Participants must be members of a society of the American Turners at least three months prior to the tournament. Membership card must be available for presentation at registration.
- 4. Societies who do not permit members until age 21 are permitted to enter golf members(s) from age 18 by certification of the President of the society. The entry must state the age of the golfers(s) under this provision.
- 5. Any applications received after the deadline of June 15, 2020, may be accepted by the host society only if there is space available. The application must be accompanied by an additional \$10.00 processing fee. All applications sent to the host society must be filled out completely and include the full entry fee.

SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS FOR MEMBERS OF AMERICAN TURNERS

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. The American Turners National Organization is offering a Scholarship Grant annually to its members that are working in a degree program at a fully accredited College or University. Only applicants who are planning to major in a Physical Education, Sports Medicine, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, or Recreational Therapy curriculum will be considered. Exceptions, however, are possible for students who have been involved over a number of years in Turner programs and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.
- 2. The By-laws of the American Turners provides the authority and purposes for the granting of Scholarship Awards by the American Turners. This By-law also provides that "The Scholarship Committee of the American Turners shall develop a scholarship plan containing rules and regulations to determine the eligibility of the applicants seeking an award and a system of priorities to select the best possible candidates".
- 3. Scholarship recipients may apply for subsequent scholarships. However, they must submit a new application each year and meet all requirements to receive an additional scholarship.
- 4. A Scholarship Grant will be offered for the **Junior year** and **Senior year** only.
- 5. Scholarships will only be awarded for Undergraduate College or University programs. No scholarships will be awarded for Post graduate programs, Professional or Trade Schools or for Community or Junior Colleges.
- 6. Special consideration will be given to applicants in one of the five (5) fields: **Physical Education**, **Sports Medicine**, **Physical Therapy**, **Occupational Therapy or Recreational Therapy**. Exceptions will be made for other majors for candidates who have been involved in American Turner programs and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.
- 7. Electronic courses pertaining to one of the five (5) majors listed in #6 must be offered by an accredited college or university.
- 8. Scholarship recipients may receive a maximum of two (2) scholarships. You may first apply going into your Junior year of study. If for some reason your application was denied going into your Junior year, you may then re-apply going into your Senior year.
- 9. The <u>completed</u> Application for an American Turner Scholarship must be received by the National Office of the American Turners postmarked no later than <u>July 1st</u> of any given year. Any applications received <u>after July 1st</u> will be returned to the applicant and will have to be resubmitted for consideration the following year.
- 10. All applications postmarked by July 1st, and qualified by membership, will be screened by the American Turners National Office and then forwarded to the National Scholarship Committee (NSC). The NSC will then review each application to determine if the applicant meets all the requirements as stated in these rules. The NSC has the final decision in the awarding of scholarships.
- 11. The National Scholarship Committee shall determine the number and amounts of scholarships to be awarded each year.
- 12. After an application for an American Turners Scholarship Grant has been approved, the National office will make payment of ½ of the total amount of the Scholarship Grant paid directly to the College's or University's Admissions Office, Registrar's Office or Financial Aid Office as indicated on the Application for American Turner Scholarship form chosen in the name of the applicant. The second ½ of the total amount of the Scholarship Grant will then be paid at the beginning of the second semester to the respective College or University upon notification from the school that the applicant is still enrolled as a full time student in good standing, and the submission of a transcript of grades for the completed semester along with a schedule of classes for the 2nd semester.
- 13. If the applicant's Major or accredited College or University changes after the application was approved, the American Turner's National Office and/or the National Scholarship Committee must be notified.

SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS FOR MEMBERS OF AMERICAN TURNERS

REQUIREMENTS OF APPLICANTS

Check List

1. The applicant must be a member for a minimum of twelve (12) months prior to July 1st of any given year and be in good standing with his or her Society; Memberships at Large included. The official membership anniversary date is the date printed by the National Office on the annual membership card.
2. A scholastic recipient may receive a maximum of two (2) scholastic awards. If you are entering your Junior year, you may apply for a scholarship. You may apply for a scholarship award going into your Senior year whether you received a previous award or not, or if this is your first time applying for an award.
3. Special consideration will be given to applicants in one of the five (5) fields: Physical Education , Sports Medicine , Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy or Recreational Therapy . Exceptions will be made for other majors for candidates who have been involved in American Turner programs and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.
4. The applicant <u>must submit</u> a transcript of completed grades from the prior year of the College or University he or she has Attended as in the case of a transfer, or is currently attending. Additionally, the student must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 grade point scale or a 3.5 on a 5.0 grade point scale for each semester. A minimum of twelve (12) credit hours or its equivalent must be maintained for the duration of the scholarship.
5. Applicants must secure endorsement from both their respective Turner Society President and their District President. These signatures must appear on the application form <u>before</u> the application is submitted to the American Turners National Office for consideration of the National Scholarship Committee.
6. The applicant <u>must submit</u> with the application form, a Fall registration schedule for the selected College or University (such College or University must be recognized and located in the United States); the school within the College or University. The same is expected for the Spring semester.
7. The applicant <u>must also submit</u> with the application form an estimated cost for tuition & books for the year. And, please submit the <u>address</u> and <u>phone number</u> of the institution's Admission's, Registrar's or Financial Aid's Office of the selected College or University where the Scholarship Grant is to be remitted.
8. The applicant <u>must submit</u> a written essay of at least one typewritten page titled "How I Am Involved in the American Turners Today and What My Plans are for Involvement in the American Turners in the Future."
9. The applicant must submit a letter of recommendation from a society officer noting how the student has been involved in their society.
10. The applicant must complete a minimum of twelve (12) hours of volunteered service within his or her Society. If a Turner Hall is not available, a minimum of twelve (12) hours of community service must be performed in the name of American Turners in the same calendar year when the application is submitted. The minimum hours of service must be completed by July 1 st of any given year. The completed number of service hours must be approved by either the Turner Society President or the community representative.
11. ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTS must be sent to the American Turners National Office and post marked no later than July 1st of any given year.
