Hopefully everyone is in summer mode now that the weather has turned warmer. Along with the summer comes some events on the National level namely National Golf in Monaca Turners in Pennsylvania, National Softball at Ft. Wayne in July and the Bi-annual National Conventional in Louisville. At the National convention there will be a few things being presented to be acted upon.

First is increase of National Membership fees from the current \$8.25 to \$12 per member per year or annually. The last increase in Membership fees was about 10 years ago. As with our lives over the last ten years costs have increased. The National council has taken several actions to cut cost namely- doing virtual conference calls, closed a store front office and have our National council meeting following the Bi-annual convention at Louisville Turners to save travel expenses. Third, we will need a new National Bowling chair as Franklin Jones who was elected at the last convention passed last July due to an illness. I have volunteered to do the chair but we need a new chair to take over moving forward. The chair needs to be USBC member and have some working knowledge of the bowling rules. I am planning to run for Vice-president this year again so your support would be appreciated.

From the National Health & Physical Education Committee

Here is the line-up for this summer's National events:

National Softball Tournament – hosted by Ft. Wayne Turners, July 23-24, 2022. Get your teams together. It'll be a fun weekend.
National Golf Tournament – hosted by Monaca Turners, July 13-14, 2022. Start swinging your clubs now to get ready for a great event.

Our **National Festival** is only a little over 1 year away! Have you started your fund raising yet? Give it a try to help encourage more participation at the Festival. New Ulm Turners is hosting the National Festival in July of 2023. If you haven't been to New Ulm Turners, this is a great time to make the trip. They have a wonderful club located in a great little town and we will have access to excellent venues for the Festival. They are planning a grand event!

In keeping with our German heritage, one of our Track & Field events is the Hurlball. I recently had some people question where they could obtain a hurlball to practice. As far as I know, they are not sold in the United States. It has to be ordered on-line. A few years back I purchased some for the American Turners through the company Sport-Thieme. Their website is <u>www.sport-thieme.com</u> and they are called "Sling Balls". Another company, Kubler-Sports, also sells them and they call them "Slingshot Balls". Their website is <u>www.kuebler-sport.com</u> (yes, the company name is spelled slightly different than the website name) At the National Festival we use a leather hurball with a weight of 1500g, but they are offered in other weights too. So if you want to get back in the groove of throwing a hurlball, or have new members that don't have a clue what to do with a hurlball, you can order one of your own. Just remember you are ordering from Europe, so it will not arrive in 2-3 days like Amazon.

As I mentioned in our last issue of Turner Topics, Pickleball will have more age groups: 18-29, 30-49, 50-69 & 70+. It will still be played as doubles with no gender requirements. It was also mentioned in my last article that we dropped the Sr. Men and Sr. Women Volleyball divisions. The NHPE Committee discussed it further and we have decided to keep all the divisions as we had in the previous Festival. It is our hope that we will

get more entries in the Senior Volleyball divisions at this Festival. The swimming pool does not have starting blocks, therefore everyone will start by standing on the edge of the pool to dive in. There is one more change to diving. We will not have access to a pool with a diving board, so we will not be offering diving at this Festival. However, New Ulm has an interesting replacement. In their pool area, they have a Water Ninja course. We will offer the Ninja course as a separate swimming event. It will be very different and a lot of fun. More information will be coming later.

Keep looking at all the Turner Topics from now until July of 2023 for the most up to date information on the Festival. Or better yet, attend the National Convention at Louisville Turners in August to get all the updates, including a copy of the revised Festival Rulebook and the Marching and Mass Drill routine.

NATIONAL FESTIVAL NEWS

2023 National Festival

The American Turners National Festival is coming to New Ulm in the summer of 2023. On September 23, 2021, the Turner National Council accepted the New Ulm Turners' bid to host the event -- the oldest continuing sports festival in the United States. The first Turnfest was held in 1851 in Philadelphia. Known as "The People's Olympics", the event is held once every four years, giving Turners the opportunity to compete in sports and cultural events. Although the New Ulm Turnverein is one of the oldest and most significant clubs in the United States, it has never hosted the National Festival.

One contribution of the Turners to American life has been the organization's advocacy of fitness and physical education. Their efforts encouraged the adoption of physical education into the curriculum of school systems across the country, advocating for classes for both boys and girls.

Reflecting the Turners' motto, "A Sound Mind in a Sound Body," Turnfest is divided into two areas of participation. The physical competition includes men and women's gymnastics, rhythmic gymnastics, tumbling, track and field events, swimming, diving, volleyball, golf, tennis, mass drill and model drill exhibitions. Cultural exhibitions and events include more than 100 categories from scrap books to fine art to solo and group music, speech, and dance performances. The Turners have always been a family organization and participants range from nine years of age to ninety.

ENDOWMENT TRUST

Dear Turners,

The Endowment Trust Fund is one of the financial arms of American Turners. The ETF is funded through endowments and memorials. The Endowment Trust carriers out the organization's mission of a Sound Mind, Sound Body through offering various gymnastics and physical education grants, scholarships, and donations provided to Districts and Societies within American Turners. The Endowment Trust Fund is managed by six Trustees and the American Turner's National President following rules and regulations found in its Declaration of Trust. The Endowment Trustees are open to new ideas and suggestions as to how we may best serve the membership of American Turners and perpetuate "A Sound Mind and a Sound Body"

On behalf of the Trustees, I'm pleased to inform you of the following changes of the Endowment Trust offerings which took effect **January 1, 2022**. These are:

- 1. An increase of the maximum amount payable by the Endowment Trust to \$3,000 for the Society Payroll Reimbursement Grant.
- 2. An increase of the maximum amount payable by the Endowment Trust to \$2,000 for the 50/50 Physical Education Equipment Grant
- 3. New: First Aid/CPR/AED Grant
- 4. New: Edwin E. Colton Honorary Award

REMINDER: A requesting Society must have a minimum of 50% of their competitive team members, under the age of 18, be a <u>Youth Member</u> or a child of a member of American Turners to qualify for #2 and #3 above. Youth Members are required to renew their membership annually.







OBITUARIES

Aurora Turners





Jerome R. Jacquin was born July 24, 1934, to George and Mary Jacquin, in Buffalo NY, where he was raised with his older brother John (Jack), his best friend.

Jerry had many adventures while growing up in Buffalo, and it was there he met the love of his life, Joan. They moved to Indiana for Jerry to attend Normal college at Indiana University (IU) studying Physical Education. He later earned his master's degree at Northern Illinois University in Dekalb, IL. They lived in married housing in a small trailer where Joan helped him study and get thru school. After graduation, they moved to Warrenville, Illinois.

They later bought a house in Wheaton where Jerry became a football and gymnastics coach at Wheaton Central High School where he taught for many years. He had several students win gymnastics competitions and a few that went on to train for the Olympics. His most famous students at the school were the Belushi brothers John and Jim. He told many stories of John always getting into trouble with his clownish antics during football practice. Jerry was later inducted into the Illinois Coaches Hall of Fame. He left teaching to become the Executive Vice President at Clarke Mosquito

Control, where he later retired in 1997. A little-known fact about Jerry, he worked for WGN, Chicago and did live broadcasts for sports segments- during the black and white tv era!

Jerry was a very good gymnast and won many competitions. One of his specialties was on the rings. In later years, he was inducted into the Indiana University Hall of Fame for his contributions to the sport and received a special ring which he always wore with pride.

He is also remembered for dressing as a clown and doing crazy antics and silly dives during the water show each summer.

He was an amazing volleyball player and not only played in weekly tournaments, but also played in the Senior Olympics in Utah. He competed every four years in the National Turner Olympics in gymnastics, swimming, diving and volleyball. He went as far as to have a reverse shoulder operation and knee replacement so he could continue playing volleyball into his 80s. Jerry was also a wonderful dancer and leader, even if you had two left feet, he could sweep you across the dance floor as if you'd be doing it for years.

Jerry & Joan had four grandchildren – AKA – his "Big Kids", Peter & Jeanna who called him Gramps and then later, Abbie & Dylan, who called him Papa, as well as two great-granddaughters, Eshaya and Brooklyn. Their kids and grandchildren were their pride and joy and the loves of their lives. They were the best parents and grandparents ever, spending as much time as possible with their grandchildren, having sleepovers, playing games, putting on skits and shows, having pillow fights, making them their favorite foods and showering them with their love, time and affection. They were very silly and so much fun.

After the tragic death of their son Jerry Jr, a deep sadness kicked in and Jerry Sr.'s health started deteriorating. Kim and Tim moved their parents to Illinois to be close to them for their final years. The day before he passed, he lay in bed, arms pointing to the sky as if reaching for Joan, waiting from the heavens above.

Jerry is survived by his daughter, Kim (Tim) Brooks Belvidere, IL; daughter-in-law, Dyan (Michael) Bryskier, Palatine, IL. Four grandchildren, Peter Jacquin, Jeanna Jacquin, Abbie (Waden) DelosSantos and Dylan Brooks. Two great-grandchildren, several nieces and nephews as well as other beloved friends and family members.
