## THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Well the month and half after the 2022 National Convention held at Louisville Turners has seen a lot of changes. At the convention Dennis Zeller was reelected as President and on Saturday, September 3, Dennis resigned for personal reasons. According to our By-Laws I took over as National President. John Beary was elected as the new Vice-President. I would like to thank Dennis for his time as President, and all of the endeavors he did for American Turners.

Just a little info on me, I have been a member of Aurora Turners for 49 years, have held offices in the society, district and national levels, I am a Honor Key member and have attended over 20 National Conventions. Some of the goals I would like to see happen is increase membership, increase participation in events, local, district and nationally, help societies in some way and improve communications among everyone.

The convention saw several changes that will start after January 1st 2023 and some that started immediately. National dues will increase from the current \$8.25 to \$12 as this was passed at the convention. This is the first dues increase in about 10-12 years. This will enable American Turners to perpetuate the organization in the future.

The items that start immediately are, the National Bowling chair is now part of the NHPE committee but will still function as it has in the past. Emily Miesner of Louisville was elected as the new NHPEC Chairperson. Michelle will work with her for the intermediate future to get her up to speed; mainly thru the 2023 National Festival in July of next year. The 2024 American Turners National Convention will be held in Aurora, Ill. sometime in the summer of that year.

The convention was entertained by the Louisville Circus on Saturday and was very enjoyable to see. If you have never seen the Circus and can get a chance please do see it quite amazing. A lot of old friendships were renewed, and new friendships were formed. I think one thing that came away from the convention was that no matter the size of the society we all have similar issues, how to increase membership, how do we get more membership participation in club activities, how to get members to volunteer and help at club functions.

The biggest event next year is the 2023 National Festival to be held in New Ulm, MN and hosted by New Ulm Turners. If you have never been to New Ulm it is a quaint city founded by Turners. There is a brewery in town, Schell Brewery, which was established by a Turner Member and is still owned by a Turner member. I would encourage everyone to start planning on going to and participating in the festival next July. You can do a number of athletic events, cultural activities or go and just cheer on your society. The Turner Topics starting in January will have information on the Festival, athletic events, cultural events, housing, food and entertainment.

and productive member or the club. During the 1970's he helped with maintaining

deteriorating building. He helped with fund raising so new land could be acquired in the future for a new building. He worked bingo and chaired the drawdown raffle committee which generated large sums of revenue. He became a Board of Director and in December of 1978 he was elected president and served from 1979 through 1981. During this time construction of our new building was completed.

During the 1980's Joe remained active, serving in various capacities including Financial Secretary. He also continued to volunteer his time helping to maintain our old building because we used that building to conduct bingo which was still a large income stream for the club. He also continued fund raising, working bingo, drawdown raffle and ham and turkey raffles.

During the 1990's, Joe continued his efforts to keep the old building usable for bingo. He also started doing various maintenance jobs around the new building. He also served in various club offices cumulating with election to President for 1999 and 2000.

During the 2000's Joe continued as President for 2001 and 2002. In the summer of 2001

Aurora Turner Club broke ground for their new gymnasium, a dream Joe had for many years had been accomplished. The gym was completed in the fall of 2002 while Joe was still President. Bingo was moved to the new gym and the old building was razed, but Joe still found jobs that needed to be conducted at the new property, including mowing, minor maintenance and seal coating the outdoor bowling lanes as needed.

During the 2010's while Joe was serving on the Board of Director's he discovered that the City of Aurora was charging us double water rates because we were outside city limits. He remembered we had an agreement with the city that we didn't have to pay double rates. Working with our attorney they found the agreement and presented it to the city. The city agreed and refunded \$17,000.00 in over paid fees and the city now only charges us single rates.

During Covid he worked numerous hours on his own time to obtain a PPP loan for the club which was approved for over \$80,000.00 then forgiven by the federal government. During this time, he also applied to Dick's Sporting Goods for a \$5000.00 grant which was approved and delivered to the club.

During the 2020's Joe oversaw the construction of two bathrooms up by our softball field, doing most of the work himself. He also painted interior walls in the gym. He served as a Board of Director in 2020 and 2021.

Joe has attended numerous District Conventions, National Conventions, Turnfests and many Bowling Tournaments.

Greetings Turners,

Hope this communication finds you well. The Endowment Trust held its annual meeting electronically via zoom on Thursday June 16th from 18:33 PM CT to 20:03 PM CT. All Trustees were present except John Beary who was excused because of a personal matter.

Despite the ETF's financial portfolio having dropped 25% to 30% from its high mark in November of 2021, the ETF has been able to provide \$8,533.10 in the form of grants and awards so far in 2022. Year-to-date donations of \$1,700.00 have been received in memoriams and for the good & welfare of the organization. Madison Turners has paid the remaining balance of their loan of \$6,360.83 in full. And the lien held by American Turners Endowment Trust has been officially released in the County of Dane, WI. Concordia Turners has an outstanding loan with a remaining balance of \$20,414.78. Monthly payments of \$460.07 have been made without default or delay.

All offerings of the ETF were reviewed during the annual meeting. Except for the following, all other offerings will remain the same for 2023:

• First Aid/CPR/AED Grant: This grant will be extended from American Turner Teacher/Instructor/Coach to other American Turner members that are available or on the premises to provide assistance if needed.

Congratulations to Carol Steinhaus, New Ulm Turners – Wisconsin District, Inge Pape Trampler, New York Turners – New York District, and Joe Lusk, Turn Verein Frisch Auf aka Aurora Turners – Illinois District for being selected as the 2022 Edwin E. Colton Award Honorees for their countless contributions made in their respective American Turner Society. A picture and a small bio can be found in this issue of each one of the honorees.

The Trustees voted unanimously for an American Turner Society or District to receive any offering of the Endowment Trust, they must be in Good Standing with American Turners. This means that 1) the annual membership fees must be paid in full and 2) the National Directory information formerly referred to as the Statistical form must be submitted to the National Office.

Unanimously Trustee Bozonelos was re-elected as President and Trustee Lesperance was re-elected as Vice President to serve a 2YR term. The special meeting adjourned at 4:02 PM EST.

# EAST SIDE TURNERS M&M GYMNASTICS PROMOTE ADULT GYMNASTICS

After her recent adult successes with competitive USA Gymnastics, Chellsie Memmel inspired many adults to consider trying gymnastics as an activity for competition or just for fun and fitness. Turners, of course, have been doing this for generations. Chellsie has also been appointed as a member of a 3-member group in USA Gymnastics that is responsible for the direction of the US team. She is also a member of the American Turners.

Chellsie came up with the idea to promote gymnastics through a camp called Dream More / Do More Adult Gymnastics expecting a possible 40 adults. In three days, the camp filled with 70 adults with 30 on a waiting list. A second camp was added in August that also filled with 80 gymnasts. Another one-day workshop will be held in November.

The three-day camps had gymnasts in different groupings based on their experience levels. There was a wide range of abilities from very beginner to fairly advanced gymnasts. The age range was anywhere from 20 - 55. It was not necessarily dominated by the younger groups. Gymnasts came from as far as Alaska and Puerto Rico. There were at least 20 states represented with people from both coasts. In the second camp we had three very welcome guests from River City Turners as campers. I had the opportunity to work with Lisa Greenwell in one of my groups. The adults were fascinating to work with. You could not ask for a more eager or attentive group to work with. I felt that these individuals really deserved to be taught gymnastics.

The camp featured Linda McDonald to give her expertise on judging, Danielle from California to give really helpful stretching and fitness advise, Andy and Chellsie Memmel, as well as many other coaches for gymnastics. The days were really fun and intense with everyone learning how to work in adult gymnastics. Of course, there was a nice social event at a nearby facility so everyone could talk about their experience. On January 27 - 29, M&M Gymnastics will be hosting the Chellsie Challenge Gymnastics Competition with an adult AAU session. It will be held at a sports complex with Men, Women, and Tumbling and Trampoline competitions at all levels. High Five Meets will be including it in their competition series.

#### **Sheboygan Turners**

#### Albert J. Udovich October 29, 1927 - September 6, 2022



Al passed away peacefully in the comfort of his home on September 6, 2022. He was born in Sheboygan on October 29, 1927 to Joseph, Sr. and Louise Udovich. He attended Ss. Cyril & Methodius Grade School and graduated from Central High School, class of 1947.

While in high school in 1943 he practiced teeter board acrobatics along with his high school sweetheart, Carol Schmidt. They both became part of the "Langs" professional teeter board act. Both Al and Carol performed in shows on weekends and all summer long until graduation. After that entertaining was year-round in the U.S. and Canada. They both performed their teeter board act with the "Langs" in places including but not limited to the Roxy Theater, Radio City Music Hall, the Chicago Theater, and were opening acts for headliners including Bob Hope and the Three Stooges. They also performed on the Ed Sullivan Show several times.

On September 30, 1950 Al and Carol were married. In November 1950, seven weeks after their wedding he was drafted into the U.S. Army. Al's boot camp was at Camp McCoy, WI and further training was at Ft. Knox, KY where he was assigned to the newly formed 487th Transportation Truck Co., designed for Korean warfare. He was one of the few that stayed at Ft. Knox until

November 1952 when he was honorably discharged.

His show business and military life quickly became one of work and volunteering.
