

The convention saw several changes that have started as of January 1st. National dues have increased to \$12 as this was passed at the convention. This is the first dues increase in about 10-12 years. This will enable American Turners to perpetuate the organization in the future. Dues are also due by March 31, 2023 and if they are not paid participation in National events will not be permitted. The National Bowling chair is now part of the NHPEC committee but the bowling committee will still function as it has in the past. Michelle will work with her for the intermediate future to get her up to speed; mainly thru the 2023 National Festival in July of next year. The 2024 American Turners National Convention will be held in Aurora, Ill. sometime in the summer of that year.

We have pulled the O & P manual off line to review and make sure it is accurate. The plan is to have it completed by February 1st. The executive team, President, Vice-President, Corporate Secretary and Treasurer are establishing rules for employee reviews. This will be done annually. We are also looking at any other items that need to be established.

This issue has the forms for scholarships in for the current calendar year. The scholarship form and rules will be reviewed for the 2023-24 scholarship year.

The biggest event next year is the 2023 National Festival to be held in New Ulm, MN and hosted by New Ulm Turners. If you have never been to New Ulm it is a quaint city founded by Turners. There is a brewery in town, Schell Brewery, which was established by a Turner Member and is still owned by a Turner member. I would encourage everyone to start planning on going to and participating in the festival next July. You can do a number of athletic events, cultural activities or go and just cheer on your society. The Turner Topics for March/April will have information on the Festival, athletic events, cultural events, housing, food, map and entertainment.

Please remember to support your society by attending events hosted at your society, running for office at your society as things don't happen on their own, volunteer to help run or work at events at your society and lastly just get involved.

We have roughly 6 months to get in shape, choreograph routines, organize volleyball or pickleball teams, do some fund raising or create some arts and crafts. If you are not sure about participating, please give it some serious thought. The Festival is for everyone! If you can jog/walk 3 miles, swim some laps in the pool, swing a golf club, or just have fun on the Volleyball or Pickleball court, you should join us. So, if you think you are not good enough because you do not work out in the gym every day, think again. Some Turners go for the competition, others go just to have fun. Either way, we all enjoy the camaraderie. So don't miss out on a good time with fellow Turners.

A special issue of Turner Topics will be sent out in the near future packed full of Festival information. But here are a few things I would like you to note:

• On-line registration will start in April. The last day to register, without paying a late fee, is June 10, 2023. You can still register between June 10 and June 20, 2023; however, you will have to pay a late fee of \$20.00 per person. Absolutely no registrations will be accepted after June 20, 2023.

- Cultural competitors must register on-line and also mail their separate "cultural entry form" to Sue Knisley.
- Members must follow the rules as stated in the Festival Rulebook:

"Competitors, if eligible for membership in their Societies, must be a member in good standing, with a membership number issued by the National Office, prior to the Festival registration deadline. All other contestants must be either a spouse of a card-carrying member, a child of a card-carrying member under the age of eighteen (18) or a Youth Member for 90 days or more. All competitors in any American Turners National competition must present their membership card at the tournament site.

Pursuant to the 2008 National Convention, it is acceptable for a child under the age of 18 to participate in Turner National events (physical and cultural competition) even if their parents are not members. However, that child must be a paying enrolled student of a Turner society for at least 90 days prior to the National event and show proof of same. There will be an extra fee for a non-member (child under the age of 18) to compete at the National event. All adults must still be a Turner member in order to participate at a National event."

So make sure you get your membership paid in a timely manner and that your society sends the payment into the National Office no later than March 31, 2023. This will allow Kate time to process the application and get the membership cards to the individuals before they try to register for the Festival. I will follow up with the Societies to confirm that "non-member children" are enrolled in their society program(s).

- 5. Any applications received after the deadline of June 30, 2023, may be accepted by the host society only if there is space available. The application must be accompanied by an additional \$10.00 processing fee. All applications sent to the host society must be filled out completely and include the full entry fee.

#### SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS FOR MEMBERS OF AMERICAN TURNERS

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

1. The American Turners National Organization is offering a Scholarship Grant annually to its members that are working in a degree program at a fully accredited College or University. Only applicants who are planning to major in a Physical Education, Sports Medicine, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, or Recreational Therapy curriculum will be considered. Exceptions, however, are possible for students who have been involved over a number of years in Turner programs and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.

2. The By-laws of the American Turners provides the authority and purposes for the granting of Scholarship Awards by the American Turners. This By-law also provides that **"The Scholarship Committee of the American Turners shall develop a scholarship plan containing rules and regulations to determine the eligibility of the applicants seeking an award and a system of priorities to select the best possible candidates".** 

3. Scholarship recipients may apply for subsequent scholarships. However, they must submit a new application each year and meet all requirements to receive an additional scholarship.

4. A Scholarship Grant will be offered for the Junior year and Senior year only

5. Scholarships will only be awarded for Undergraduate College or University programs. No scholarships will be awarded for Post graduate programs, Professional or Trade Schools or for Community or Junior Colleges.

6. Special consideration will be given to applicants in one of the five (5) fields: **Physical Education**, **Sports Medicine**, **Physical Therapy**, **Occupational Therapy or Recreational Therapy**. Exceptions will be made for other majors for candidates who have been involved in American Turner programs and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.

7. Electronic courses pertaining to one of the five (5) majors listed in #6 must be offered by an accredited college or university.

8. Scholarship recipients may receive a maximum of two (2) scholarships. You may first apply going into your Junior year of study. If for some reason your application was denied going into your Junior year, you may then re-apply going into your Senior year.

9. The <u>completed</u> Application for an American Turner Scholarship must be received by the National Office of the American Turners postmarked no later than <u>July 1st</u> of any given year. Any applications received <u>after July 1st</u> will be returned to the applicant and will have to be resubmitted for consideration the following year.

10. All applications postmarked by July 1<sup>st</sup>, and qualified by membership, will be screened by the American Turners National Office and then forwarded to the National Scholarship Committee (NSC). The NSC will then review each application to determine if the applicant meets all the requirements as stated in these rules. The NSC has the final decision in the awarding of scholarships.

11. The National Scholarship Committee shall determine the number and amounts of Scholarships to be awarded each year.

12. After an application for an American Turners Scholarship Grant has been approved, the National office will make payment of  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the total amount of the Scholarship Grant paid directly to the College's or University's Admissions Office, Registrar's Office or Financial Aid Office as indicated on the Application for American Turner Scholarship form chosen in the name of the applicant. The second  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the total amount of the Scholarship Grant will then be paid at the beginning of the second semester to the respective College or University upon notification from the school that the applicant is still enrolled as a full time student in good standing, and the submission of a transcript of grades for the completed semester along with a schedule of classes for the  $2^{nd}$  semester.

13. If the applicant's Major or accredited College or University changes after the application was approved, the American Turner's National Office and/or the National Scholarship Committee must be notified.

Greetings Turners,

First and foremost, I'd like to extend an apology to Inge Pape Trampler for stating she was a member of New York Turners in my last report. Inge has been a member of LIT (Long Island Turners) joining in 1955 although she has been and still is quite involved in ATNY.

I'm pleased to inform you that in 2022, the Endowment Trust provided seventeen (17) grants, one (1) donation, and three (3) honorary awards disbursing \$29,103.30. There was \$518.33 in administrative costs totaling \$29,621.63 in expenditures. Nineteen (19) donations were received equaling \$7,230.00. As of this writing, the current holdings of the American Turner's Endowment Trust Fund are: \$9,347.01 in the Old Second National Bank checking account and \$560,147.88 invested with Moloney Securities for an unaudited balance of \$569,494.89.

As a reminder, the ETF's offerings are available January 1<sup>st</sup> through November 30<sup>th</sup>. You are encouraged to visit the web address: https://americanturners.org/endowment-trust-fund to see all the offerings of the American Turners Endowment Trust Fund and to fill out an application form to start the process.

Notable changes to the Endowment Trust Fund offerings starting January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 are:

- For an American Turner District or Society to receive any offering of the Endowment Trust, they MUST be in Good Standing with American Turners. This means that 1) the annual membership fees must be paid in full and 2) the National Directory information formerly referred to as the Statistical form must be submitted to the National Office.
- First Aid/CPR/AED Grant: This grant has been extended from one (1) American Turner Teacher/Instructor/Coach per Society to include one (1) American Turner member per Society that is on-premises where no gymnastics or physical education classes are regularly being held.
- Edwin E. Colton Honorary Award: The due date to receive the Endowment Trust application, a summary of the nominee's contributions and written and signed letter of acknowledgement must be either postmarked or received by June 1<sup>st</sup>.

In closing, I'd like to express my sincere gratitude and appreciation to each of the Trustees and to the American Turner's membership. Together we share in the successes of perpetuating American Turners motto of a Sound Mind Sound Body through gymnastics and physical education. Your efforts and contributions are greatly appreciated!

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

# TURNERS IN NAMBIA

Beyond the borders of Germany, the appeal and reach of Turnerism reached far and wide. Of course, this was most evident in regions of the world where there were concentrated populations of German immigrant who brought this concept with them when settling in distant areas which were often quite culturally different from Germany. The attached 4 photographs are from present day Namibia, formerly German Southwest Africa. Turner Halls were located in several communities in this German colony including the capital city Windhuk, the coastal communities of Lüderitzbucht and Oranjemund, and other towns such as Keetmanshoop, Karabib and Kolmannskuppe.

Northwest Davenport (Iowa) Turner member Kory Darnall recently returned from Namibia where he met with a representative of the Lüderitzbucht Männer-Turnverein to deliver a letter of greetings from The Northwest Davenport Turner Society President Marcia Gray-Lossing. Marion Schelkle received the letter on behalf of the Vorstand of the Lüderitzbucht Männer-Turnverein, which read as follows:

On behalf of the membership of the North West Davenport (Iowa, USA) Turner Society, I wish to extend to you and your members our greetings from across the ocean.

Our two communities have much in common regarding our shared cultural heritage and our mutual struggle to keep it alive and vibrant. We wish your organization continued successes now and in the future.

# Akron Turners-Bill Severns Sr.



### Bill Severns Sr.

Bill Severns, Sr. passed away on October, 31st 2022 at the age of 81. Born in Akron, OH on September 20th, 1941. Preceded in death by mother Pauline McIntyre, stepfather Frank McIntyre, father William Severns, and grandson Zachary Boatwright. He is survived by

his wife Linda, children William Severns, Jr. and Christine (Thomas) Boatwright, granddaughter Haley Boatwright; and stepdaughter Alexis McDonald.

Bill was a graduate of Buchtel High School, and attended the University of Akron. He worked most of his career at Americhem, Inc. in Cuyahoga Falls, OH. While employed at Americhem, Bill did a Tour of Duty in Vietnam, and was always proud to be a Veteran.

Bill officially became a member of the American Turners when he was 18. He was a member for 63 years, but was exposed to Turnerism all his life, his parents being active Turners, themselves.

Since the age of five, Bill was active in Turner programs. As a junior, he was a Turner gymnast, fencer, and track & fielder. He competed in Turner AAU and was a National Festival Medalist, as well as compiling collections for presentations in the National Cultural Competitions.

Bill had not only competed as a contestant in National Festivals, but he also coached teams in at least five National Festivals in Track & Field and Volleyball. On a local and district level, he also taught fencing classes to our Turner youth. In 1995, Bill was presented with The American Turners' highest honor, The National Honor Key Award.

Bill was President of the Akron Turners during its most volatile period. If it was not for his dedication and leadership, this society could have reached its demise. Bill held the position of President for ten of the thirteen years that The Akron Society was going through its transitional period. While moving from its original and beloved location, he helped hold together this organization as it faced a new and uncertain future. After playing an integral role in securing the current location, and building a new and prosperous facility, he helped grow the organization in membership through many of the programs that he led. Bill also served on the Board of Directors of The Akron Society as Treasurer, Bar Manager, and Budget Director. Up until his passing, he served as an advisor to the board in many capacities.

During the time that he was helping The Akron Society, he also took over a floundering Lake Erie District. The district had been experiencing much dissension and the ultimate loss of one of the strongest societies. Bill's counsel has contributed to its return to a fully functioning and nationally recognized district.

Bill served as National President for two terms, and was on the National Council for several years. He served as President of the Lake Erie District for 20+ years, served as Regional Councilor, and District Representative. He was also a Region IV Councilor for several years until regions were dissolved. He continued to serve as a leader and Director of Lake Erie delegates to the National Conventions and had done so until the early 2000's.

Bill continued to make himself always available to societies and districts as a source of information, direction, guidance, and any other assistance he could offer. He also did this on a National Level by writing and co-writing articles for the Turner Topics.

Turner Severns dedicated much of his life to furthering the cause of Turnerism and was outstanding in promoting Turner principles on all levels of the American Turners.
