#### **Toledo Turners**




#### **Alvin Henry Striggow**

Alvin was a 72-year member of the American Turners-Toledo, joining at age 18. He joined the Toledo Turners and the Czechoslovakian Sokol Hall to pursue gymnastics that he learned in high school physical education classes. He was the physical education chairman and the gymnastics coach at the Toledo Turners for many years. Alvin also coached at the West Toledo YMCA, Bedford Community Education classes, and annual Turner performances at the German American Festival. He was very skilled in his trade and mechanical endeavors. In addition to building his family home, Alvin constructed a side horse for his children to practice gymnastics, and he also purchased or adapted other gymnastics equipment so he could have additional practice sessions for his children at home.

Alvin Henry Striggow, age 91 of Temperance, Michigan, passed away from lymphoma and skin cancer on November 12, 2023. Alvin was born on September 19, 1932, in Toledo, Ohio. He graduated from Whitmer High School in 1950 where he played on the Whitmer football team that won the 1949 GNC Championship. Alvin, nicknamed "Boob", participated in the Whitmer Circus and in the coed tumbling activities with his future wife, Nancy Guion Ray. Alvin and Nancy organized the Whitmer Class of 1950 Reunions and held the monthly Whitmer Alumni luncheons for nearly 20 years beginning in early 2000. Alvin was in the first Trades and Industry classes that were started at Whitmer by teacher Thad Speiers. In 1949, while in high school he did co-op with his father's business, Douglas Motor Rebuilding Company. Alvin then earned his tool and die journeyman's credit working with George Zak's tool and die and Modern Pattern Company, Toledo, Ohio. As a pattern maker, Alvin also worked for Schnorberger Pattern Company, Monroe, Michigan; Guy P. Dulla Pattern Shop, Allen Park, Michigan; Ford Motor Company, Dearborn, Michigan; and Acme-Cleveland of Detroit, Michigan. Alvin drove 120 miles round trip daily to Detroit before it was customary to commute long distances to work. He twice turned down mandatory weekend overtime because he felt it took too much time away from his family. He retired in 1994 after spending his last ten working years at Seaway Pattern Company, owned by a high school friend, Richard Johnston.

Alvin was preceded in death by his parents, Alvin Edward and Mildred Marie Askins Striggow, brothers Edward Raymond and infant brother, John Alvin. He is survived by his best friend and wife of 69 years, Nancy Guion Ray Striggow, and seven children: Valerie (William) Ubbes, Scott Striggow (Rachel Striggow); Vicki (William) Salisbury; Leslie (Chris A.) Holdorf; Lori (Wayne) Pavlika; Jeffrey (Michelle) Striggow; and Glenn Striggow (Tina Striggow). He is also survived by 35 grandchildren and 24 great grandchildren. Alvin was surrounded in life by his family and a wide circle of friends including many Turner members and Whitmer Alumni. The burial was in the Toledo Memorial Park Cemetery, 6382 Monroe Street, Sylvania, Ohio. Condolences may be left for Alvin's family on Mike Pawlak's Funeral Home Legacy page.
